For behaving just as we wish, without thinking of you; Christ, have mercy. **Christ, have mercy.**  For failing you by what we do, and think and say;
Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.
May the God of love and power forgive us and free us from our sins, heal and strengthen us by his Spirit, and raise us to new life in Christ our Lord.
Amen.

Let us pray. Silence. The Collect for today is said. We respond with **Amen**.

#### Short Talk or Reflection

followed by a time of silence.

Let us declare our faith in God. We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named. We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love. We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high. We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.
