### **PREPARING OURSELVES**

### **LETTING GO**

If you come to this time of prayer and reflection with any regrets, with things that you wish you had not said, done or been, offer them to God in the silence of your heart. And then, when you are ready, reflect on the angels' song of peace.

With sorrow brought by sin and strife the world has suffered long and, since the angels sang, have passed two thousand years of wrong: the nations, still at war, hear not the love-song which they bring:

O hush the noise and cease the strife, to hear the angels sing!



If you wish, dip your finger into a bowl of water and make the sign of the cross on your palm.

Our verse takes us on a journey through time. A journey back to the stable where the shepherds arrive breathless. Their hearts are full of the great, great news that the angel gave to them and of the song the angels sang high above their Bethlehem hillside.

But the angel said to the shepherds,

'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news
that will cause great joy for all the people.

### LISTENING TO GOD'S WORD

### After Christmas...

When they had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. 'Get up,' he said, 'take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him.'

So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'Out of Egypt I called my son.'

When Herod realised that he had been outwitted by the Magi, he was furious, and he gave orders to kill all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity who were two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had learned from the Magi. Then what was said through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:

'A voice is heard in Ramah,
weeping and great mourning,
Rachel weeping for her children
and refusing to be comforted,
because they are no more.'

After Herod died, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who were trying to take the child's life are dead.'

So he got up, took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. Having been warned in a dream, he withdrew to the district of Galilee, and he went and lived in a town called Nazareth. So was fulfilled what was said through the prophets, that he would be called a Nazarene.

### God protects...

After the wise men go home by a safe route filled with joy and hope, reality sets in. Herod and the Romans are not ready to accept God's King – the Messiah. Families in the Bethlehem area lose their precious sons. The holy family become refugees. It is a bitter start to our Prince of Peace's life on earth. It also foretells of the rejection, torture and death that is to come. The leaders in Jerusalem will not calm their own views so that they can hear the song of the angels and accept the peace Jesus brings.

God's overseeing of the Christmas story does not end with the exit of the wise men. We see his fatherly care for Mary and Joseph and baby Jesus. He guides their journeys. First, there is the flight into Egypt — a reversal of the first Exodus. Second, there is the return to the promised land — to Nazareth in Galilee. It will be a safe place for Jesus to grow up with Mary and Joseph, and his heavenly Father too, watching over him.

What stands out is God's protection. During Herod's rampage and the exile in Egypt, God is monitoring events and sending his angels to keep this precious family safe. God is one who protects.

How have you experienced this in your own life?

Who needs to experience God's protection today?

Pray for yourself. Pray for others. Give thanks that God is one who sees – acts – protects. He will be with you as 2026 begins.



And still the days are hastening on — by prophets seen of old — towards the fulness of the time when comes the age foretold: then earth and heaven renewed shall see the prince of peace, their king; and all the world repeat the song which now the angels sing.

Lord Jesus, your early life was full of dangers. You had to flee your home in Bethlehem, live as a refugee and settle in a new place. You know God protects. Lord, help me to trust in his fatherly care... Lord, hear my prayer.

Lord Jesus, you understand the plight of the world's refugees, you know what it is like to be homeless and stateless. You have compassion for them. Lord, help the world to have compassion too... Lord, hear my prayer.

Lord Jesus, Joseph had the huge responsibility of keeping you safe, of caring for you as his own son. He did a great job. Caring for the ones we love is not always easy. Lord, help those who are struggling...

Lord, hear my prayer.

Offer your own heartfelt prayers and yearnings, praise and thanksgivings.
